IMPORTANT ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

As per BPS attendance policy, students are allowed up to 9 days of unexcused absences during a semester. After 9 unexcused absences have occurred, student may be in jeopardy of needing an attendance appeal or worse, failing due to absences (FA) if more unexcused absences continue. Excused absences that are not counted towards the 9 days are doctor notes, court notes, or religious holidays. Parent notes/calls are not excused absences.

NJHS SUPPORTS THE CHILDREN'S HUNGER PROJECT

Jefferson's NJHS club did their part to solve hunger in their community by assembling lunches at The Children's Hunger Project Warehouse. CHP is a local organization that creates bagged meals for the weekend for elementary students on free and reduced lunch. Many elementary students only eat one meal a day and are unable to cook for themselves. By receiving the meals from this organization, they have at least one no-cook, no-refrigeration meal to eat on Saturday and Sunday. Thanks to their hard work, over 300 students—including students at three Merritt Island schools—didn't go hungry last weekend. Many students enjoyed the experience; if you would like to volunteer as a family or community group, they have packing events almost every night.

SGA STUFFS EASTER EGGS

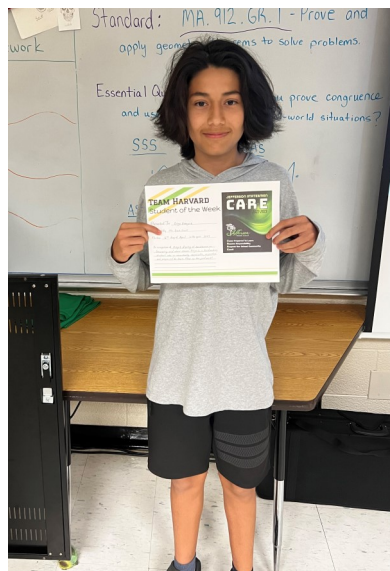
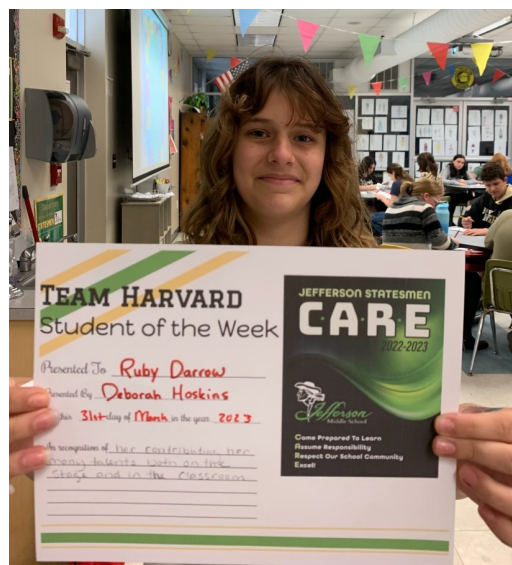

HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR VISIT

On Monday April 10th, Team Harvard students welcomed Mr. Harry Lowenstein to speak. Mr. Lowenstein is the grandfather of one of our current students and he is also a Holocaust survivor. Our group was humbled as we listened to the story of Mr. Lowenstein's life. He told us of his childhood, which started as very happy and then quickly turned dark and full of terror as his family was forced out of their home in

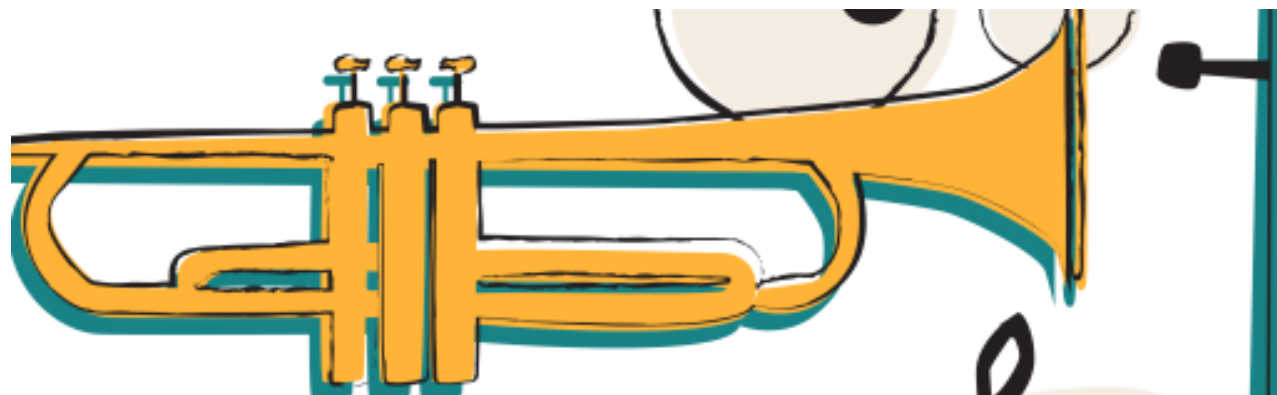


Germany and into a ghetto in a foreign country with many other families. From there, he was taken to a concentration camp and survived unimaginable conditions. After liberation, at the age of 14, Mr. Lowenstein returned to his home as the sole survivor of the family and retrieved the Star of David he was forced to wear on his clothing as a small boy. Mr. Lowenstein described the Star of David as his most prized possession and seeing the small piece of fabric brought chills to some of us in attendance. Mr. Lowenstein is a kind, thoughtful, quiet, forgiving, and wonderful man. He reminded us that even through the absolute worst situations, there is hope. He also reminded us that our troubles and trials make us who we are. Team Harvard sends their gratitude and appreciation to Mr. Lowenstein for allowing us to experience this once in a lifetime opportunity.

- Buses leave at 3:30– Students will meet in the cafeteria before departure
- Tickets will be on sale during lunch February 21st through the 24th. Students that wish to purchase tickets after that week will need to speak to Ms. Clevenger. Due to limited bus space, we have 140 tickets to sell. These will be sold on a first come, first serve basis.
- Students must be in groups of 2-3 (or more) **AT ALL TIMES.**
- Students will not be required to stay with their chaperones, but they will be required to have dinner with chaperones and check in with chaperones throughout the night.
- Parents **MUST** be on time to pick up students at Jefferson at the end of the night.
- **COST:** \$149 (\$95 for the ticket and \$54 for the bus. All students must ride the bus to and from the event.)
- **INCLUDES:** Charter bus, admission, meal ticket (included in the ticket price)
- Students will need to bring money for extra drinks or snacks.

Behavior, Attendance, and Academic Requirements

You must be a current 8th Grade student in good standing.

- 1) NO Suspensions-This includes:
 - * Bus Suspensions
 - * In-School OR Out of School Suspensions
- 2) No more than **2** referrals
- 3) You CANNOT FA (fail due to absences) ANY CLASSES first semester
- 4) You CANNOT have **9** UNEXCUSED absences for the third nine weeks
- 5) NO FAILING GRADES (F) for ANY CLASS first SEMESTER AND 3rd nine weeks.

- Jefferson teachers will be chaperoning the Gradventure trip. They are so excited to be able to share the experience with the 8th graders.
- Due to limited bus capacity and Gradventure ticket policy, parent chaperones will not be utilized for this event.

Dates to Remember

- Money and permission slips are due during lunch sales the week of February 21st-24th.
- Students will sign up with a groups as they purchase tickets. Chaperones will be assigned to groups by the end of April. Students may not switch groups once chaperones have been assigned.

Points to Remember

- **Dress Code:** Students are to wear the Jefferson Team shirts, Jefferson gym shirts. This is to help chaperones identify and monitor Jefferson Students. If students do not have a team shirt or gym shirt, they can purchase them in the front office. Students must also wear appropriate shorts or pants and closed toe shoes.
- **BEWARE:** Universal has a policy against ripped jeans or shorts... you will not be let on a bus if you break dress code.
- Year-round pass CANNOT be used because Gradventure is a special event.
- You must be at school **ALL DAY** on May 19th.

Thomas Jefferson Middle School students can earn Sand Dollars (school currency) by meeting posted expectations in the classroom, in the cafeteria, in the commons area, in the media center, and on the bus. Sand Dollars can be awarded by any staff member!



JMS teachers also recognize students by sending home Positive Behavior post cards or giving students Positive Behavior Referrals for following classroom expectations throughout the week. Students with Positive Behavior Referrals receive an extra treat on Fridays.

The JMS school PBIS store is open once a week during each lunch period. Students can use Sand Dollars for snacks, candy, school supplies, JMS merchandise, gift cards, and special privileges, etc. Privileges can include passes to cut the lunch line, funds to make cafeteria purchases, or even Chick-fil-a lunch.

Sand Dollars can also be used to purchase other PBIS incentives such as popcorn in the cafeteria and time outside during lunch.

In addition to all this, JMS hosts a Sand Dollar Spectacular once a semester. Students use Sand Dollars to participate in Sand Dollar Spectacular activities such as movies, Bingo, baking, and so much more!

The Library Mission statement: The mission of the library media center is to create information literate citizens who effectively access, evaluate, and use resources to encourage and prepare students to be life-long learners.

The library provides materials and services that meet academic, technical, personal, and social needs of the school community. Materials for the school libraries are selected by professionals who are trained to develop collections for their school based on the needs of their population and curriculum, independently of their personal opinions or beliefs.

The media selection policy includes a wide range of materials with a varied range of reading and interest levels. Book selection is based on but not limited to student interest, instruction, cultural representation, socioeconomics and various points of view. Because libraries are forums for information and ideas, books are provided for the interest and enlightenment of all students and teachers.

As with all other aspects of a student's education, parents are encouraged to be involved in a student's book selections. The books in the media center, whether part of a specific reading program or not, are available for the review of all patrons.

CELL PHONES/HEADPHONES/EARBUDS

JMS is NOT responsible for lost, stolen, or broken electronic devices. Furthermore, JMS does not have the resources to investigate lost, stolen, or broken electronic devices including cell phones, headphones, earbuds, and/or any other electronic device.

- All Jefferson Middle School students must complete a cell phone contract BEFORE bringing a cell phone on campus. This contract will be completed during registration. Once a cell phone contract is on file, it is valid for the entire time a student attends Jefferson Middle School.
- If a cell phone is obtained after registration or cell phone information changes, it is the student's responsibility to contact the front office to either complete or update a cell phone contract.
- **Cell phones, headphones, and earbuds must be turned off and out of sight at all times while on school property. If cell phones, earbuds, and/or headphones are seen by an adult, they WILL be confiscated and placed in an envelope with the student's information on it. Confiscated cell phones will be locked in the school vault until a legal guardian can come to the school to retrieve it. If a student refuses to give their cell phone, headphones, and/or earbuds to a teacher or other school employee, an administrator will be called to confiscate the cell phone and the student will receive a lunch detention. If a student refuses to give their cell phone, headphones, and/or earbuds to an administrator, they will receive an out of school suspension.**
- If a student's cell phone, headphones, and/or earbuds are confiscated, a legal guardian must pick them up. **Confiscated cell phones, headphones, and/or earbuds will not be returned to students.**
- Use of a cell phone in the school building during the school day for any reason, such as to talk, text, photograph, videotape, check the time, or access the internet is not permitted. **This includes communication with parents/guardians.**
- **Students are not permitted to electronically record anything while on campus, on the bus, or at the bus stop without prior permission from administration.** Furthermore, students are not allowed to distribute unauthorized recordings through text, social media, or any other platform. Failure to adhere to this rule will result in disciplinary action.
- **Any student who video records a fight, downloads a video recording of a fight off of social media, distributes a video recording of a fight, and/or shows to other students a video recording of a fight will receive one or more out of school suspension days.**
- If a student continues to violate the cell phone contract their cell phone privilege may be revoked.
