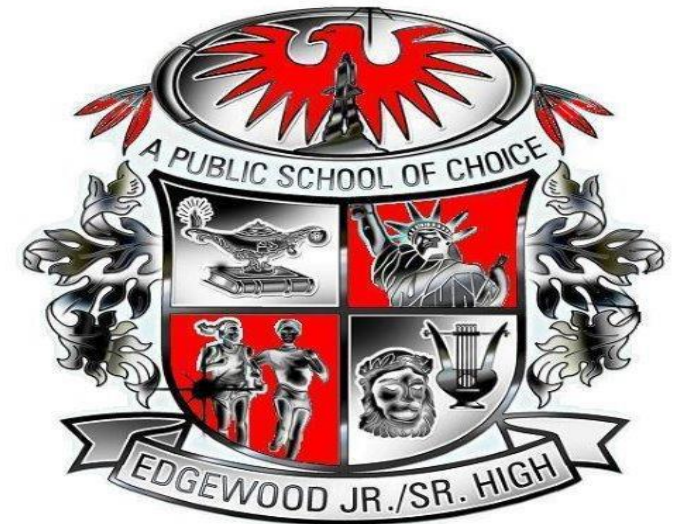

AP CAPSTONE

- AP Capstone began at Edgewood in the 2015-2016 school year
- Students are required to take 2 AP courses
 - AP Seminar (11th grade); AP Research (12th grade)
- Internationally recognized and highly rigorous
- An informational meeting will be available for parents and students who wish to pursue this avenue
- Student can earn an AP Capstone Diploma or AP Capstone Certificate

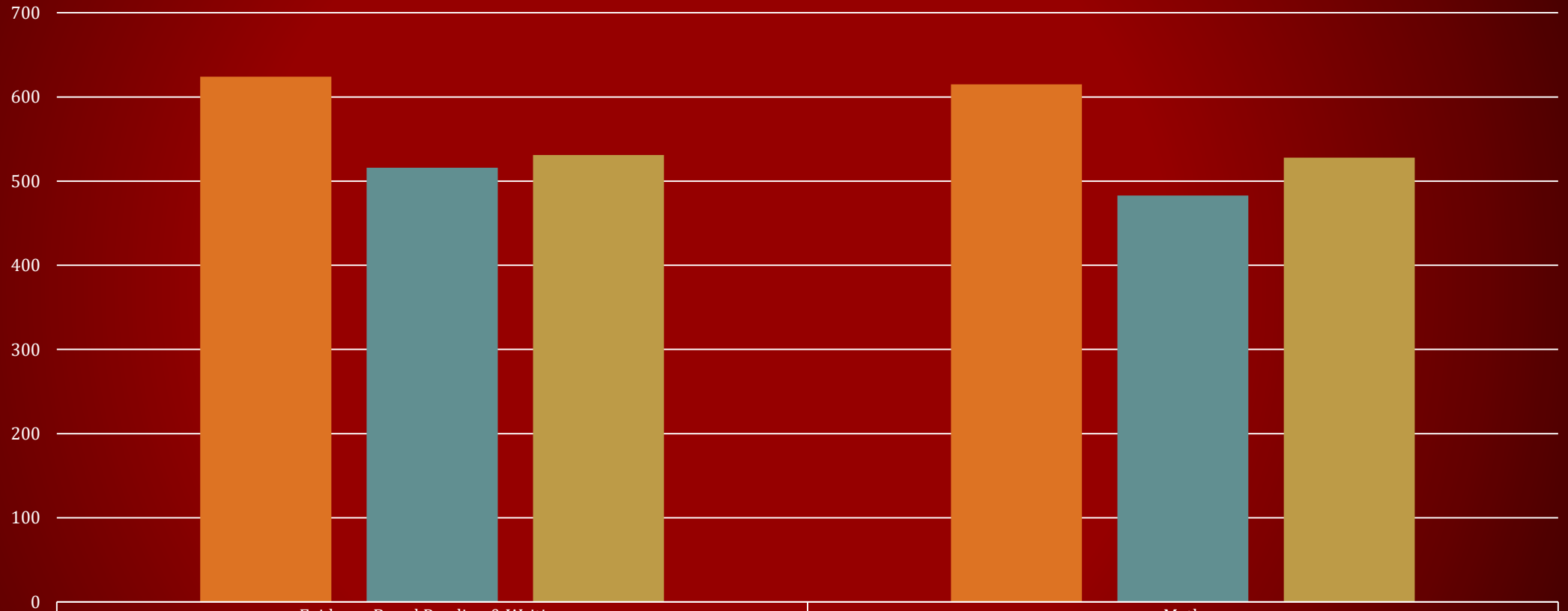

2019 SAT Scores

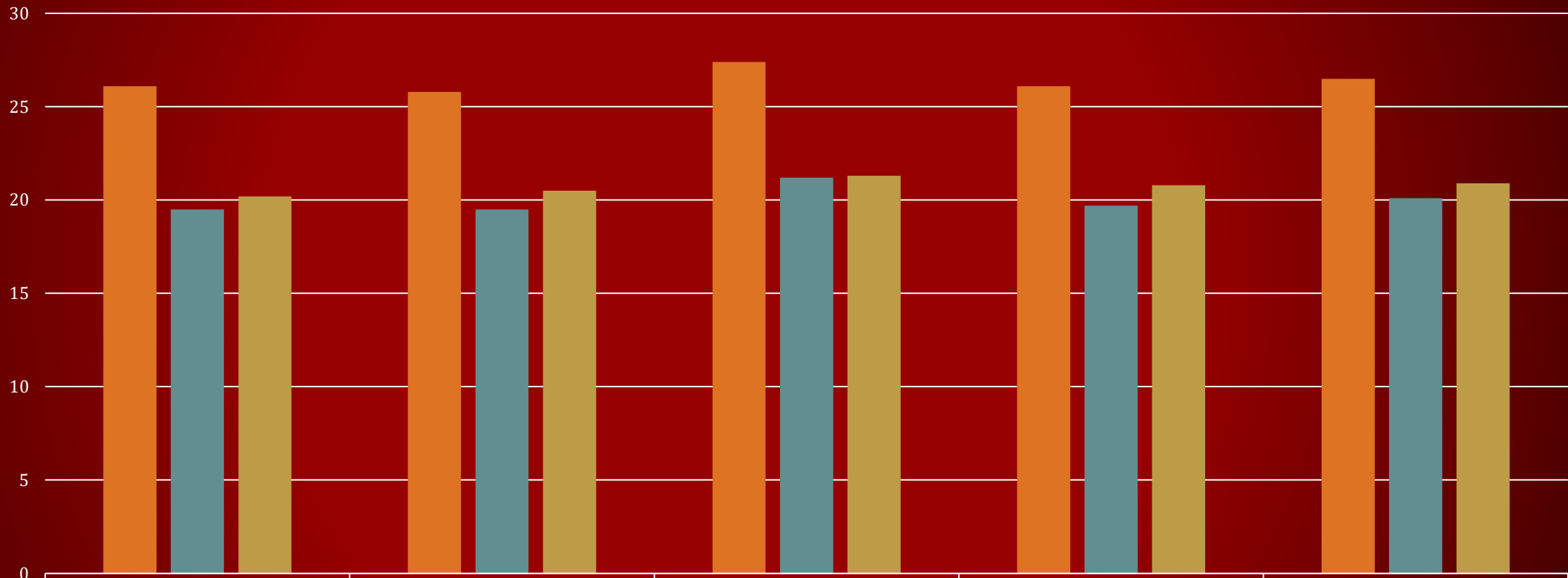

DIPLOMA OF DISTINCTION

Criteria that must be met to earn the Diploma of Distinction includes:

- Leadership experience in one or more areas or projects
- Service Learning – 25 hours per year in attendance at Edgewood
- Accelerated Study: Algebra I Honors in Middle School and at least two accelerations in High School. Acceleration in Middle School means obtaining High School credit. Acceleration in High School is passing a college class via AP or Dual Enrollment
- Qualify and complete application for at least one post-secondary scholarship
- A competitive post-secondary admission portfolio to include career and personal goals
- Successful completion of a Senior Project
- Proficient score on all state assessments including, but not limited to, End-of-Course (EOC), and Florida State Assessments (FSA)
- Students may not have any F's on their transcript from Edgewood, dual enrollment or virtual courses
- 3 years consecutive years of a World Language



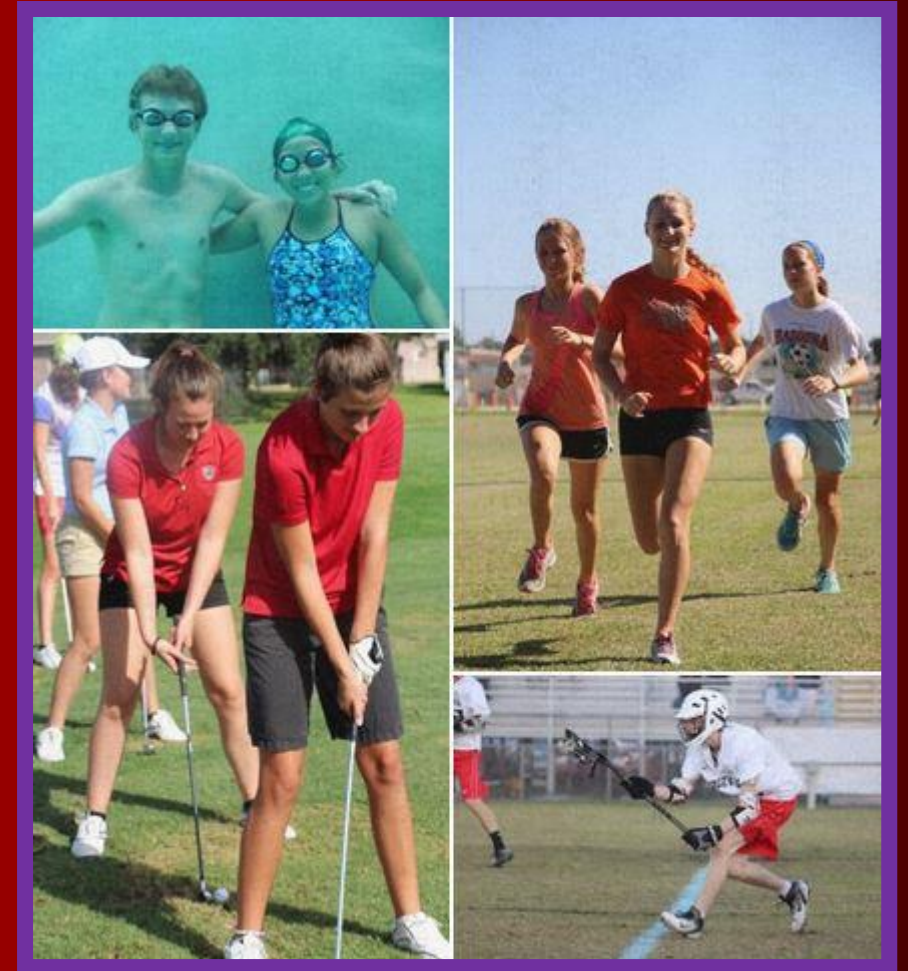
EXCEPTIONAL STUDENT EDUCATION

- Exceptional Student Education [ESE] services are consult services only
- ESE endorsed guidance counselor meets with 504/IEP students weekly
- Edgewood has a reading coach 1 day per week
- Gifted Student Services
- Each gifted student has an Educational Plan (EP) managed by a teacher with gifted endorsement certification
- Gifted students are grouped through their Tribe (homerooms)
- Teachers using gifted learning strategies

 - Includes 30 minutes for lunch



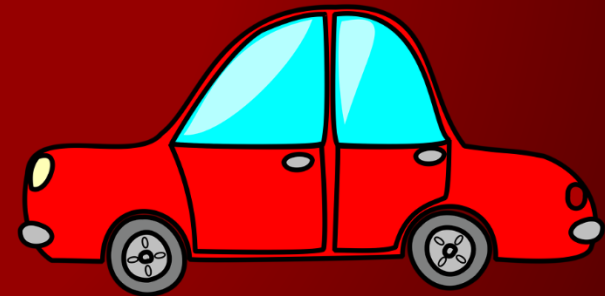
STUDENT CONDUCT

 - District policy guidelines



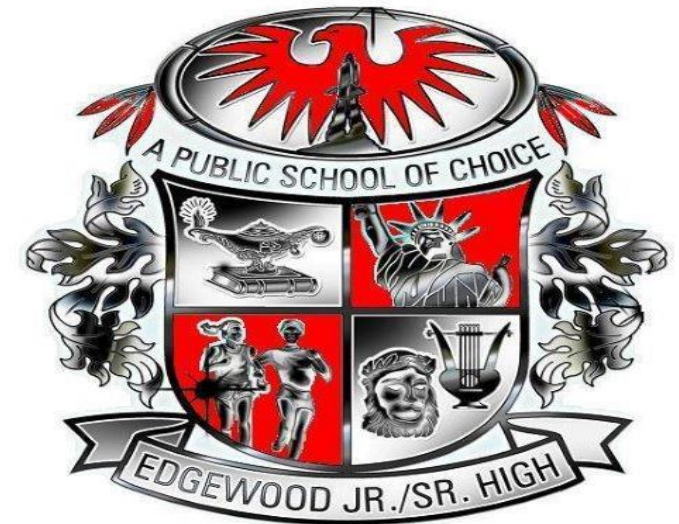
TRANSPORTATION

- Regional bussing is available for all students (choice of location)
- Edgewood currently has 6 busses – pick up locations will vary
- 2 car loops for drop off and pick up
 - Track
 - Student Parking
- No student pick up / drop off in bus loop



- Students must be on grade level (by appropriate assessment scores and grades)
- Applications must be completed online via the Family Dashboard
- Applications must be completed online by 11:59 pm on Monday, December 2, 2019
- Deadline is absolute
 - Application and processing fee of \$30.00
- Sibling preference is based on space availability
 - Siblings must meet admission criteria and online applications must be received by the deadline
 - If a sibling is granted preference, the sibling originally enrolled must remain enrolled at Edgewood for the entire 2020-2021 school year

APPLICATION PROCESS



LOTTERY

- Students are granted conditional acceptance based on a public lottery
- The district has implemented a uniform lottery system
- Lottery will take place in Equity, Innovation, & Choice
- Parents will have access to their lottery status via the Family Dashboard
- Application and the wait list number is good for one year only

- Notification letters of conditional acceptance will contain all registration information
- Evening Orientation & Registration Meetings
 - Attendance is required
 - January 14th, 2020 6 PM
 - January 16th, 2020 6 PM

Important Reminders

- Applications must be completed online (ensure accuracy)
- All supplemental documents must be uploaded when completing the application
- Application / Processing Fee of \$30.00 is required at the time of application
- Application deadline is 11:59 pm December 2nd, 2019
- Acceptance is **CONDITIONAL** based on standardized assessment scores and grades
- You may apply to more than one choice program
- Acceptance Deadline January 31st, 2020
