

Transdisciplinary Learning

4th Grade Ecosystem Inquiry

Fourth grade students have been inquiring into ecosystems and the concept of interdependency. They learned a great deal about the Indian River Lagoon through a presentation by the Brevard Zoo. They were able to learn about and decorate oyster shells to use in creating oyster mats as water filtration systems in order to help preserve this delicate ecosystem in our local backyard. In addition, they were able to transplant mangrove seeds and take them home to continue caring for this valuable lagoon plant life. These activities helped students see how humans benefit from ecosystems such as the Indian River Lagoon, and our greater responsibility in taking care of the world around us. The pyramids students created required students to research ways to protect various ecosystems and reflect on the many benefits to us as humans. Finally, students participated in an inquiry into owl pellets. In this investigation, students dissected owl pellets and discovered bones of various animals. This helped students see the interdependency of animals within a food web. Inquiry engagements such as this lead to further student inquiries and action.
