New This Year

The district has updated the Student Code of Conduct. Thank you to all that have signed and returned the acknowledgement form. If you haven't already done so, please do so as soon as possible. The entire Code of Conduct can be viewed on the district website. Some highlights from the new Code of Conduct are as follows:

• At Jackson, cell phones are to be turned off and in their backpacks during the day. Cell phones are only allowed in the cafeteria during lunch.

- pending possible placement in an alternative setting.
 - Updated Dress Code Policy (the entire policy can be viewed on the district website)
 - All clothing must be appropriately sized, securely fastened and cover midriff, back, sides, and all undergarments at all times.
 - Garments must be of a length and fit that are acceptable to the build and stature of the student. The cut of sleeveless garments must not expose undergarments. Clothing must cover the body from one armpit across to other armpit. Upper garments should meet lower garments.
 - Pants and shorts shall conform to the build and stature of the student, shall be worn at the waist, and shall not extend below the heel of the shoe in length. Rips, holes, or tears in clothing must be below midthigh.
 - $\circ\quad$ Shorts must have clearly discernable inseams that cover the buttocks.
