





Does your child like solving problems? Do they enjoy thinking creatively? Then FPS might be for them! Future Problem Solving (FPS) has been an internationally recognized program for more than 40 years. Founded by the "father of creativity", Dr. E. Paul Torrance, FPS has provided a rich experience for children to think critically about a variety of topics through an articulated process.

Future Problem Solving is a competition whereby students are presented with a detailed situation in which they use a 6-step problem solving process to determine challenges, solutions and an action plan; all set in the future. FPSers, as we are called, compete at the district, state and international levels. Over the past several years, Freedom 7 competed at the International
