



2021-2022 Collegiate High School: Getting Started


1. Attend a Virtual Collegiate High School Information Session

- ✓ Congratulations! You have been invited to consider Collegiate High School because your 2020 Fall Term GPA was 3.0 or higher.

2. Return Student Interest Form

- ✓ If you are interested in participating in Collegiate High School after viewing the presentation, return the *Student Interest Form* to your counselor by your school's deadline.

3. Complete Your EFSC Online Application

- ✓ Apply for admission to EFSC. You will need to know your Social Security Number (SSN) and your state unweighted high school GPA. Collegiate High School students should select AA for Program of Study.
- ✓ Go to the EFSC webpage at www.easternflorida.edu and click the  button.

4. Complete the Required Online Dual Enrollment Orientation

- ✓ After you receive your EFSC acceptance letter, complete the Online Dual Enrollment Orientation.
- ✓ Log into the myEFSC portal. Refer to your acceptance letter for your Student ID and initial password.
- ✓ Find the EFSC Student Application section. (On the left on a desktop computer)
- ✓ Click the down arrow on the Application menu; scroll to "Dual Enrollment Student Orientation" and click "Launch."

5. Take the PERT at your school or EFSC

- ✓ Score college-ready in reading and writing for acceptance into Dual Enrollment and Collegiate High School.
- ✓ If you need to retake, work with your counselor to reschedule the test after 30 days.
- ✓ To schedule the PERT test on an EFSC campus, call 321-632-1111.
- ✓ To submit a remote placement testing request form to take the ACCUPLACER, go to <https://www.easternflorida.edu/admissions/placement-testing/college-credit-placement-testing/>

6. Turn in the Collegiate High School Student/Parent Agreement

- ✓ Sign the Student/Parent Agreement if you decide to participate in the program.
- ✓ Return the Agreement to your counselor by your school's deadline.

7. Complete all Collegiate High School requirements by Monday, May 3, 2021

- ✓ This includes applying to EFSC, completing the orientation, testing, retesting, and submitting the Student/Parent Agreement.

8. Meet with your High School Counselor to complete the EFSC Dual Enrollment Registration Form

- ✓ Collegiate High School students may take 2 classes in the summer and up to 3 in the fall.
- ✓ Submit your completed form to Advising by logging into myEFSC and uploading the document.
- ✓ Check your EFSC student Titan Email for information about the status of your registration.
